Subject: Surface Water Management Issues

Thank you for the opportunity to discuss surface water management issues with the School District at the upcoming March 6 joint Council meeting. My main goal for reaching out to the School District is to primarily establish contacts with interested school staff that may want to incorporate surface water education into their curriculum. I have a few examples of the types of collaborations being done around the region that I can mention, which include:

[Newspapers in Education \(NIE\)](#) – The Seattle Times operates a program that pulls together education materials on a variety of topics and produces periodic inserts that are included in the Seattle Times general publication. Kenmore has collaborated with other Lake Washington communities twice (2015 & 2016) to put together a stormwater education piece. This 8-page educational insert went directly to hundreds of schools around the Puget Sound area in addition to being included in the Seattle Times general circulation. I would like to make sure that any interested Kenmore educator's that want this resource can receive it. According to the Seattle Times, the Salmon and Stormwater inserts produced by this group is a favorite with school teachers.

[King Conservation District Education Program](#) – Kenmore is a participating jurisdiction with the King Conservation District and has access to K-12 educational opportunities for Kenmore schools. There is the potential for City/School District partnership here.

[Nature Vision School Programs](#) – Similar to the established surface water educational programs done by KCD, Nature Vision is a non-profit organization utilized by other jurisdictions to get surface water related curriculum into class rooms. There is the potential for City/School District partnership here.

Volunteer Opportunities – The City would love to sponsor interested students who want to make a difference in their community and volunteer their time for surface water related activities.

[Puget Sound Starts Here](#) – Kenmore is a participating jurisdiction in the regional surface water outreach group Puget Sound Starts Here (PSSH). This group offers outreach materials on a variety of surface water topics, which might be of interest for school staff. For instance, one of the current campaigns focuses on car leaks and some jurisdictions have incorporated this at local high schools where new young drivers are taught about vehicle maintenance and the environmental risks of oil leaks.

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Benefits of having established contacts – Lastly, the City would like to be available for surface water questions of any type and promote the open exchange of information. Students or staff may be interested in learning how surface water is managed at their school, want to learn about water quality data collected in the city, or perhaps an environmental club is looking for a project to do. City staff are here to answer questions or at least direct folks in the right direction.
