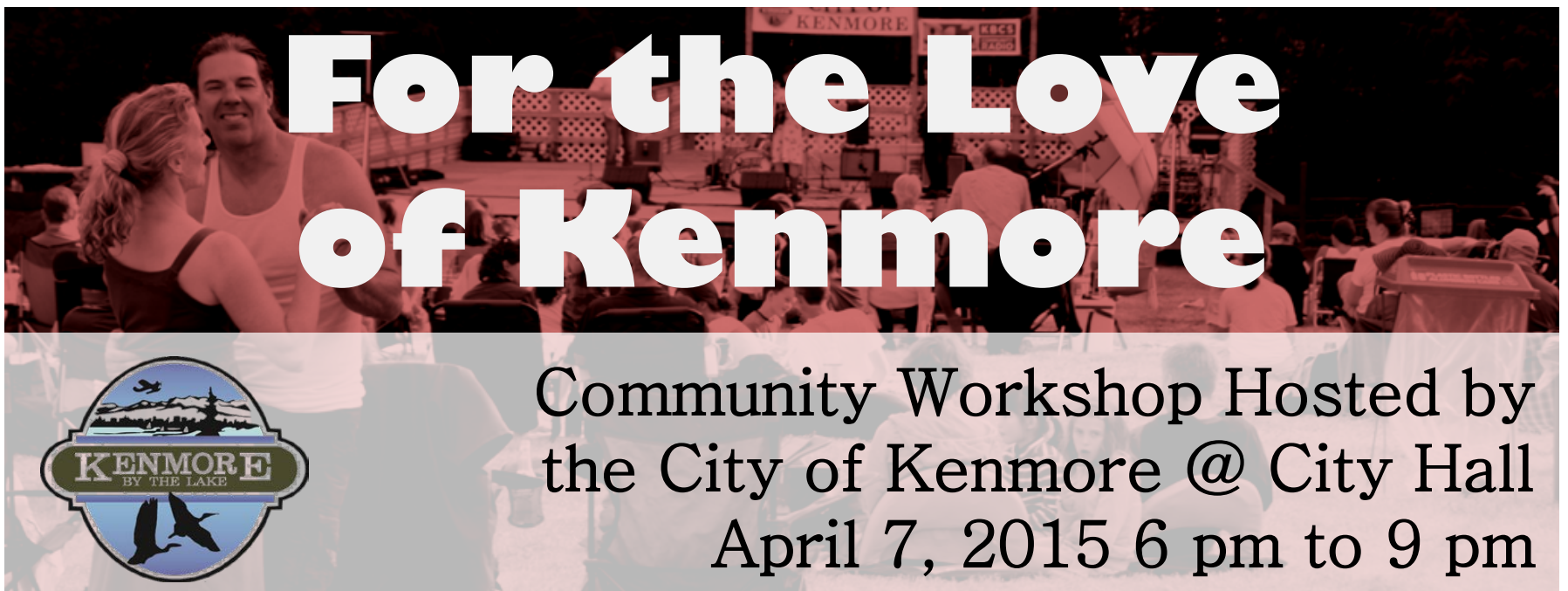

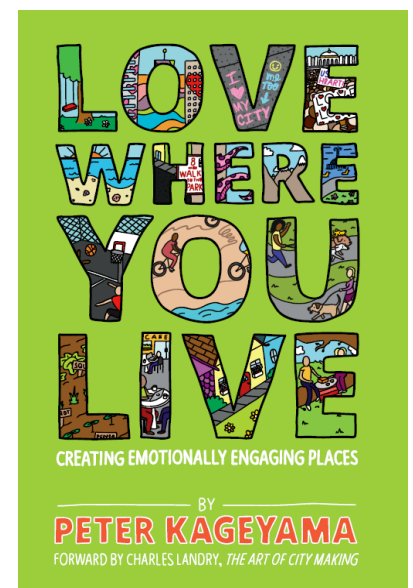


Led by internationally recognized author and community engagement expert Peter Kageyama.
